## **Task Description**

**Core Performance** – Students are to present their CORE performance piece that is representative of the topic studied: Music For Film Television, Multimedia and Radio.

- This piece can be presented as a solo or as an ensemble. If the piece is being performed as a solo, it must have a clear melody and accompaniment.
- The performance MUST BE different to the elective piece.
- The performance should include dynamic variations and appropriate expressive techniques stylistic to the chosen piece.
- The performance should be of the full piece.
- Focus should be on accuracy of pitch, timing, rhythms, and tempo

**Elective 1** – Students are to present their elective (composition, viva voce, or performance) that represents one of the following topics: Popular Music.

## **Performance**

- The chosen piece may be performed as a solo piece, with an ensemble or a backing track.
- If the chosen piece is being performed as a solo, it must have a clear melody and accompaniment.
- The piece MUST BE different to the Core Performance piece.
- The performance should include dynamic variations and appropriate expressive techniques for their chosen instrument and must be characteristic of the chosen piece and style.
- The performance should be of the full piece.
- Focus should be on accuracy of pitch, timing, rhythms and tempo.
- Students' elective must be stylistic and demonstrated features of their chosen topic.

NOTE: You must submit TWO items – 2 pieces. Each item MUST represent the two topics – Music for Film, Television, Multimedia and Radio, Popular Music

• Students have been working on their core performance since Term 4, 2023 during allocated practical periods.

- Students have been working on their elective options all term during allocated practical periods.
- During the term students have been receiving feedback on way to improve and strengthen their elective option.
- Individual elective options will have comments and advice, and a general feedback sheet of common areas for improvement will be provided to students within 10 days of task submission.

This assessment task will be completed during a scheduled period. Students will follow the attached order to present both of their pieces. Order was decided by another teacher drawing names out of a hat.
