The task will include multiple-choice and short answer questions designed to evaluate the students' comprehension of all the topics covered in the Preliminary and HSC courses taught up to this point. Students can use the following during the completion of the task. - Black pen, ruler, NESA approved calculator, NESA approved reference sheet.					
Outcomes/Competencies to be assessed in this task: ME12-1 applies techniques involving proof or calculus to model and solve problems ME12-2 applies concepts and techniques involving vectors and projectiles to solve problems ME12-3 applies advanced concepts and techniques in simplifying expressions involving compound angles and solving trigonometric equations ME12-4 uses calculus in the solution of applied problems, including differential equations and volumes of solids of revolution ME12-5 applies appropriate statistical processes to present, analyse and interpret data ME12-6 chooses and uses appropriate technology to solve problems in a range of contexts ME12-7 evaluates and justifies conclusions, communicating a position clearly in appropriate mathematical forms
