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## Task Description: Topic Test

Students will complete a topic test during class time.

The test will consist of multiple-choice and short answer questions that will assess their ability to:

- Use rates and ratios to solve problems in practical contexts, including the interpretation of scale drawings.
- Solve problems using networks to model decision-making in practical problems.
- Use mathematical arguments and reasoning to evaluate conclusions, communicating a position to others and justifying a response.

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Marking Criteria:
Each question has a mark allocation associated with it.
