Artist of Influence Research Essay

Task Description

Part 1 – Research Essay (Outcome H10) - 25 marks

Students are required to answer the following question in the form of an essay:

"Be selective about your influences. Your brain is influenced by everything you see, hear, read, smell, touch, feel or say" (Brian Tracy)

With reference to this quotation in your answer, explain how artists are influenced by the world around them. In your answer, refer to specific artists and artworks you have studied in Case Study 1 or Case Study 2.

Your response should:

- Be approximately 1000 words in length
- Discuss at least 1 artist that inspires your body of work and at least 2 artworks of theirs in total
- Use the scaffold provided and the in-class supports to inform your response
- Include quotes from artists, curators, audiences, critics and/<u>or</u> historians that support your response
- Include a reference list of where you sourced all of your information

Part 2 (a+b) - Body of Work Progress Assessment (Outcome H4, H5) - 15 Marks

a) Experiments and Visual Arts Diary (Outcome H4) - 10 marks

Students are required to submit their experimentation for a progress BOW development check-in. Students should have a range of sourced images, developed sketches, and completed BOW experiments documented in their VAD. These should all be documented in their VAD. Students are assessed on their ability to select and develop their BOW in particular ways, as representation of their developing concept or ideas.

b) Reflections in Visual Arts Diary (Outcome H5) - 5 marks

Students are required to submit their VAD for a progress check-in alongside their experiments. Students should have a range of written reflective annotations made throughout their VAD. These should demonstrate all of their consideration in the development of their BOW. There should be clear self-reflection, decision making explained clearly, documentation of all changes, annotated images of work at several stages of development, reflections of conversations with teacher and feedback etc
